## 2020-2021 School Year Summer Reading Requirements

**4th Grade**: Students entering 4th grade are required to read Katherine Applegate's book, "The One and Only Ivan," prior to the beginning of the first day of school. Students are also expected to complete the book report page, and answer questions about the book. Both of these assignments will be counted as separate reading grades. The purpose of both assignments is to help students deeper understand what they are reading. During the first few weeks of school we will continue to study the book, complete a book project, and take vocabulary and reading counts tests.

Please stress to your child the importance of reading over the summer break. Students will be allowed to take reading counts tests on anything read over the summer. Please use the website: readingcountsbookexpert.tgds.hmhco.com to find books that students can test on, as well as the lexile and point value of each book. Tip: When searching for books using this website, sometimes key words of book titles work best. You can also search by author.

Current students at Sacred Heart have received the information for summer reading. Should any of the pages be lost, extra copies can be printed from the school's website or picked up in the office.
